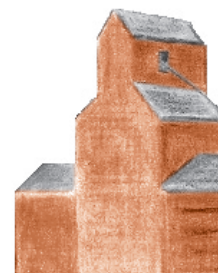

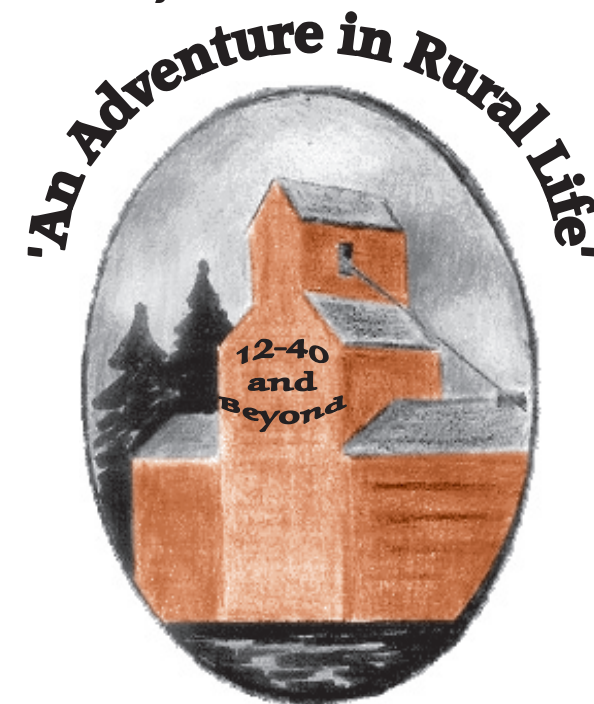

Heavenly Hills Orchard, tucked in the rolling hills south of Blaine Lake, contains four acres of saskatoon berry trees featuring Honeywood, Martin, Northline, Smoky and Thiessen varieties. These luscious, healthy, deep purple berries start to appear between the beginning and middle weeks of July and last for approximately three weeks. Tasting is encouraged as you pick your own or enjoy a pail of pre-picked and sorted. Shade parking and a picnic area are available. Open at 8 a.m.
